Chairman Grady opened the meeting and Commissioner Rich gave the invocation.

Chairman Grady recognized Commissioner Baggett who made a motion to approve the minutes of the November 12, 2019 Board Meeting and the November 18, 2019 Budget Public Hearing. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Rich and approved unanimously. Chairman Grady, Vice-Chairman Brown, Commissioners Baggett, Gross, Hickey, NeSmith, and Rich voting aye.

Chairman Grady announced the Public Hearing for Rezoning Application 19-9-1, Gerald Pionessa, Jr., agent for property owner, L and M Properties of Thomas County, LLC, has been rescheduled for January 28, 2020.

Chairman Grady recognized Commissioner Rich who made a motion to approve the resolution to submit the grant application for the FY2021 5311 Transit. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Baggett and approved unanimously. Chairman Grady, Vice-Chairman Brown, Commissioners Baggett, Gross, Hickey, NeSmith, and Rich voting aye.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION WITH THE GEORGIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR A GRANT FOR PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION ASSISTANCE UNDER TITLE 49 U.S.C., SECTION 5311.

WHEREAS, the Federal Transit Administration and the Georgia Department of Transportation are authorized to make grants to non-urbanized (rural) areas for mass transportation projects; and

WHEREAS, the contract for financial assistance will impose certain obligations upon Applicant, including the provision of the local share of project costs; and

WHEREAS, it is required by the United States Department of Transportation and the Georgia Department of Transportation in accordance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, that in connection with the filing of an application for assistance under the Federal Transit Act, the applicant gives an assurance that it will comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the United States Department of Transportation requirements thereunder; and

WHEREAS, it is the goal of the Applicant that Minority Business Enterprise (Disadvantaged Business Enterprise and Women's Business Enterprise) be utilized to the fullest extent possible in connection with this project, and that definitive procedures shall be established and administered to ensure that minority business shall have the maximum feasible opportunity to compete for contracts and purchase orders when procuring construction contracts, supplies, equipment contracts, or consultant and other services.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY <u>THOMAS COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS</u>, hereinafter referred to as the "Applicant",

- 1. That the Designated Official, <u>Michael Stephenson</u>, <u>County Manager</u>, hereinafter referred to as the "Official" is authorized to execute and file an application on the behalf of the Applicant, a City/County government, with the Georgia Department of Transportation to aid in the financing of public transportation assistance pursuant to Section 5311 of the Federal Transit Act.
- 2. That the Official is authorized to execute and file such application and assurances or any other document required by the U.S. Department of Transportation and the Georgia Department of Transportation effectuating the purpose of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.
- 3. That the Official is authorized to execute and file all other standard assurances or any other document required by the Georgia Department of Transportation or the U.S. Department of Transportation in connection with the application for public transportation assistance.
- 4. That the Official is authorized to execute grant contract agreements on behalf of the Applicant with the Georgia Department of Transportation.
- 5. That the Official is authorized to set forth and execute Minority Business Enterprise, DBE (Disadvantaged Business Enterprise) and WBE (Women Business Enterprise) policies and procedures in connection with the project's procurement needs as applicable.
- 6. That the applicant while m king application to or receiving grants from the Federal Transit Administration will comply with FTA Circular 9040.lG, FTA Certification and Assurances for Federal Assistance 2021 as listed in the <u>Georgia State Management Plan</u>.
- 7. That the applicant has or will have available in the General Fund the required non-federal funds to
