The Thomas County Board of Commissioners met on the above date in a regular scheduled meeting at 9:00 a.m. at the Historic Courthouse, Commission Chambers, with the following board members present:

Chairman Grady called the meeting to order, and Commissioner Rich gave the invocation.

Chairman Grady recognized Commissioner Vonier who made a motion to approve the minutes of the November 26, 2024 Board Meeting. Commissioner Rich seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously with Chairman Grady, Commissioners Baggett, Brown, Gross, NeSmith, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.

Chairman Grady made a motion to approve the agenda for the December 10, 2024 Board Meeting with the addition of an update on the Floating Local Option Sales Tax meetings by County Manager Michael Stephenson. Commissioner NeSmith seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously with Chairman Grady, Commissioners Baggett, Brown, Gross, NeSmith, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.

Chairman Grady recognized County Manager Stephenson who referenced the amended ARPA Budget in the agenda packet. The first two categories represent money that was spent on premium pay (\$3,964,360) and non-profit agencies and individual households (\$1,194,000) that experienced a negative economic impact. The remaining monies (\$3,441,640) are allocated to Reductions in Revenue to reimburse County Government for providing services due to the Covid-19 Public Health Emergency.

Chairman Grady recognized Commissioner Baggett who made a motion to approve the amended ARPA Budget as presented. Commissioner Rich seconded the motion. The motion passes unanimously with Chairman Grady, Commissioners Baggett, Brown, Gross, NeSmith, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.

Chairman Grady recognized County Manager Stephenson who noted that the 2025 Budget presented today is the same as the one presented during the Budget Work Session with the addition of \$35,000 being allocated to the Land Bank Authority.

Chairman Grady recognized Commissioner Brown who made a motion to approve the 2025 Budget Resolution for all funds. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Rich. The motion was approved unanimously with Chairman Grady and Commissioners Baggett, Brown, Grady, Gross, NeSmith, and Vonier voting aye.

Board Appointment

Chairman Grady recognized Commissioner Rich who made a motion to re-appoint Eddie Brown, Sr. to the Thomas County Assessor Board. His new term will expire on 12/2027. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Brown. The motion was approved unanimously with Chairman Grady and Commissioners Baggett, Brown, Gross, NeSmith, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.

Open Meeting to Citizens: Chairman Grady recognized Jack Sangster of 210 Forest Hills Dr., Thomasville, Georgia who came to express his support for the Floating Local Option Sales Tax. He also expressed appreciation to the Commissioners for their public service. Chairman Grady recognized Darrell Scarbrough of 116 Jordan Dr., Thomasville, Georgia who inquired about the Jordan Oaks Subdivision storm water project. Mr. Scarbrough represents the HOA for the subdivision. Jay Knight stated that they were unaware of the timing of Phase III being developed so quickly; thereby the project stopped. County Manager Stephenson added that the project, estimated at \$2,000,000 could only be funded with the new SPLOST which will begin funding in March 2025. Meanwhile, temporary concerns can be handled by calling the Public Works Department.

Reports

Chairman Grady recognized County Manager Stephenson who requested approval to designate inactive EMS accounts as "Doubtful Accounts". The requested accounts total \$746,162.83 and represent accounts in 2019, 2020, and 2021 that have remained inactive for the last three years. The accounts have also been reviewed with the County Auditor.

Chairman Grady recognized Commissioner Vonier who made a motion to move the inactive accounts as presented to "Doubtful Accounts". The motion was seconded by Commissioner Baggett. The motion was approved unanimously with Chairman Grady and Commissioners Baggett, Brown, Gross, NeSmith, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.

Chairman Grady recognized Commissioner Baggett who made a motion to call a Special FLOST 2025 Mayors' Meeting on Thursday, January 9, 2025 at 10:00 a.m. as requested by the County Manager. The County Clerk will notify the Mayors of the Cities of Barwick, Boston, Coolidge, Meigs, Ochlocknee, and Pavo. Commissioner NeSmith seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously with Chairman Grady and Commissioners Baggett, Brown, Gross, NeSmith, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.

Chairman Grady recognized Commissioner Rich who noted Paul Fryer's attendance and thanked him for coming.

Commissioner Rich made a motion to award the bid to sole bidder Martin Marietta for Aggregate Rock. Commissioner Brown seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously with Chairman Grady and Commissioners Baggett, Brown, Gross, NeSmith, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.

Commissioner Rich made a motion to award the bid to low bidder, Delta Landscape for Hydroseeding Materials. Commissioner Baggett seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously with Chairman Grady and Commissioners Baggett, Brown, Gross, NeSmith, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.

Commissioner Rich made a motion to award the bid to sole bidder, Willacoochee Industrial Fabrics for Woven Geotextiles. Commissioner Brown seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously with Chairman Grady and Commissioners Baggett, Brown, Gross, NeSmith, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.

With no further business, Chairman Grady recognized Commissioner Rich who made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Baggett seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously with Chairman Grady, Commissioners Baggett, Brown, Gross, NeSmith, Rich, and Vonier voting aye. The meeting adjourned at 9:23 a.m.
