Chairman NeSmith called the meeting to order at 6:01 p.m.

Commissioner Jeremy Rich offered the invocation.

Chairman NeSmith called for a motion to approve the minutes of the August 7, 2025, work session. Commissioner Rich made the motion; Commissioner Grady seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Chairman NeSmith called for a motion to approve the minutes of the August 12, 2025, Board of Commissioners Meeting. Commissioner Baggett made the motion; Commissioner Vonier seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Chairman NeSmith called for a motion to approve the agenda for the August 26, 2025, Board of Commissioners meeting. Commissioner Hickey made the motion; Commissioner Baggett seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

#### **Unfinished Business:**

Chairman NeSmith called for a motion to set September 1, 2025, as the effective date to turn over transit services from TCATS to SWGRC with RMS as the transit service provider. ## **Open Meeting to Citizens:**

Ms. Shirley Jackson of 727 Crowley Road, Thomasville GA had concerns whether the public was notified that transit was being turned over to Southwest Georgia Regional Commission with RMS as the transit provider. The County Manager advised that state guidelines were followed.

### Reports:

County Manager: Mike Stephenson updated the Board of Commissioners regarding setting the millage rate. A request has been sent to the Georgia Department of Revenue regarding a pending rollup rate. He suggested setting the tentative millage rate at the next Board of Commissioners meeting, September 9, 2025.

County Attorney: Bruce Warren reported that the agreement between the City of Thomasville and Thomas County for a 50' Drainage Easement at Remington Avenue contained no issues. Chairman NeSmith called for a motion to approve the Drainage Easement agreement. Commissioner Grady made the motion; Commissioner Hickey seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

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## **Committee:**

Purchasing: Commissioner Vonier made a motion to ratify the purchase of Diesel Fuel from Petroleum Products for \$2.3340 per gallon on August 14, 2025. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Rich. The motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Vonier reminded the Board that the next Purchasing meeting will be on September 2, 2025, at 4:00 p.m.

Commissioner Baggett reminded the Board that the next Public Property meeting will be on September 4, 2025, at 8:30 a.m.

Commissioner Hickey reminded the Board that the next Public Works meeting will be on September 10, 2025, at 8:30 a.m.

Chairman NeSmith called for a motion to enter into a closed session at 6:18 p.m. for discussion of a legal matter in accordance with O.C.G.A. §50-14-2(1). Commissioner Brown made the motion; Commissioner Hickey seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by Commissioner Baggett to adjourn the closed session at 6:45 p.m. Commissioner Vonier seconded. The motion was passed unanimously.

The Board entered back into regular session at 6:47 p.m.

Chairman NeSmith called for a motion to pursue legal action against Community Outreach Training Center, Inc. for misappropriating excess funds collected for administrative fees, exceeding the 20% limit stipulated in the ARPA grant contract. Commissioner Hickey made the motion; Commissioner Baggett seconded. The motion was passed with a 6 to 2 vote. Chairman NeSmith, Commissioners Baggett, Brown, Hickey, Vonier, Gross voting aye; Commissioners Rich and Gross voting nay.

Commissioner Grady made a motion to adjourn at 6:48 p.m.; Commissioner Baggett seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
