The Thomas County Board of Commissioners met on the above date in a regular scheduled meeting at 6:00 p.m. at the Historic Courthouse, Commission Chambers, with the following board members present:

Chairman NeSmith called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Commissioner Rich offered the invocation.

Chairman NeSmith called for a motion to approve the October 14, 2025, minutes. Commissioner Grady made the motion; Commissioner Brown seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Chairman NeSmith called for a motion to approve the October 28, 2025, agenda. Commissioner Brown made the motion; Commissioner Hickey seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Chairman Nesmith recognized County Manager Mike Stephenson who introduced the Group 30 Deming Orientation class. After introduction, Mr. Stephenson handed out certificates to the group. He passed out a survey that the class submitted, and the survey shows consistent with past surveys, although there are some scores and ratings that need work. Chairman NeSmith thanked the participants in the group as well as Mr. Stephenson for the work he puts into these classes.

Chairman Nesmith called for a motion to approve the 2025-2026 Health Plan Renewal with recommended \$100,000 specific deductible. Commissioner Baggett made the motion; Commissioner Grady seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Chairman NeSmith called for a motion to approve revised Budget Amendment 25-10-1 Capital Improvement Fund (\$44,375) / Archery Station. Commissioner Hickey made the motion; Commissioner Baggett seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Open meeting to citizens:

County Manager Mike Stephenson explained the County has nothing to do with school taxes and she should contact the School Board.

County Manager: Mike Stephenson stated he is working on the budget and there will be a Finance Committee Meeting for a 2026 Budget Review on Thursday, November 11, 2025, at 4:00 p.m. He also stated the Budget Hearing will be on November 17, 2025, at 9:00 a.m.

County Attorney: Bruce Warren stated a request from JoAnne Maltese, Hubs and Hops, for a special event alcohol permit for the 9th Annual Kevin's Game Fair (Quail Bash) has been submitted to the County Clerk. The event will take place November 7, 2025, at Chinquapin Plantation, 1045 Kauka Lane, Thomasville GA. The event will be from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. with approximately 300 in attendance. The plantation has its own security. Chairman NeSsmith called for a motion to approve the special event permit. Commissioner Baggett made the motion; Commissioner Hickey seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Bruce provided an update on the special permit process. He contacted the Department of Revenue, which told him that event coordinators only need state approval for alcohol permits. However, JoAnne Maltese from Hubs and Hops received different information—that both local and state approvals are required. Bruce will develop a clear procedure for handling special event permits and update the Board once it's finalized.
