Minutes

Historic Courthouse, Board Chambers, 3rd Floor 225 North Board Street April 27, 2021

The Thomas County Board of Commissioners met on the above date in a regular scheduled meeting at 6:00 p.m. at the Historic Courthouse, Commission Chambers, with the following board members present:

Chairman Brown called the meeting to order, and Commissioner NeSmith gave the invocation.

Chairman Brown recognized Commissioner Grady who made a motion to approve the minutes of the April 13, 2021 Board Meeting. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Baggett. The motion was approved unanimously with Chairman Brown and Commissioners Baggett, Grady, Gross, Hickey, NeSmith, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.

Chairman Brown recognized County Manager Stephenson who introduced the newly hired Thomas County Public Library Director, Holly Phillips. Ms. Phillips has been with the Moultrie Library for the last 12 years, with the last 9 of those serving as Director. Ms. Phillips currently resides in Mitchell County.

Chairman Brown declared a public hearing and recognized Donna Holbert, Zoning Administrator. Donna Holbert introduced application 21-4-1. Britt Wetherington agent for property owner, Mary Sue Castleberry has applied for a rezoning from Ag (Agricultural) to R-2 (Residential, Single Family) on a 5.6 acre, more or less portion of a 42.72 acre, more or less, parcel. The entire parcel is zoned Agricultural and R-2 along the portion of the parcel fronting Hwy. 84 East. The 5.6 acres, more or less, portion is located in the Agricultural portion of the parcel and has two existing homes. If approved, the zoning change will allow for the two existing homes known as 70 and 100 Vanncastle Lane to be located on individual parcels. The Planning Staff recommends approval of this application.

With no further comments, Chairman Brown closed the Public Hearing. Chairman Brown recognized Commissioner Grady who made a motion to approve application 21-4-1. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Baggett. The motion was approved unanimously with Chairman Brown and Commissioners Baggett, Grady, Gross, Hickey, NeSmith, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.

Open Meeting to Citizens: Chairman Brown recognized Mr. Tim Horchler of 101 Inwood Acres, Thomasville, Georgia who asked the Board to consider the removal of the Confederate monuments from the Courthouse lawn. He suggested an appropriate new location might be a cemetery that has the remains of Confederate soldiers. Chairman Brown recognized Ms. Shirley Jackson of 727 Crowley Road, Thomasville, Georgia. Ms. Jackson wanted to follow-up on whether or not the employees of the County had undergone any diversity or cultural sensitivity training. Commissioner Grady commented that the April 27, 2021

Department Heads had undergone training (February 22, 2021), and a revised employee conduct policy would be reviewed at the next Personnel Committee meeting.

Reports: Chairman Brown recognized County Manager Stephenson who presented a proposal from Network Technology Solutions (NTS) for the Judicial Center. Commissioner NeSmith had questions regarding the recurring monthly cost and the \$150.00 per hour charge for work done outside of the agreement. Commissioner Grady asked if this expenditure would come out of the General Fund. County Manager Stephenson responded yes, that it could come out of the Rainy-Day account or from the reimbursed COVID-19 monies that have not been earmarked but would be eligible.

Chairman Brown recognized Commissioner Baggett who made a motion to approve the NTS proposal as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Grady. The motion was approved unanimously with Chairman Brown and Commissioners Baggett, Grady, Gross, Hickey, NeSmith, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.

Chairman Brown recognized County Attorney Warren who recommended adopting a resolution for the De-annexation from the City of Thomasville for four Baytree Drive lots that are part of the Brookwood School campus.

Chairman Brown recognized Commissioner NeSmith who made a motion to adopt the Brookwood Deannexation Resolution. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Vonier. The motion was approved unanimously with Chairman Brown and Commissioners Baggett, Grady, Gross, Hickey, NeSmith, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.

Chairman Brown recognized Commissioner Rich who made a motion to ratify 2020 Budget Amendment 21-4-1 and 2021 Budget Amendment 21-4-2. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Baggett. The motion was approved unanimously with Chairman Brown and Commissioners Baggett, Grady, Gross, Hickey, NeSmith, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.
