# Minutes Historic Courthouse, Board Chambers, 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor 225 North Board Street December 13, 2022

The Thomas County Board of Commissioners met on the above date in a regular scheduled meeting at 9:00 a.m. at the Historic Courthouse, Commission Chambers, with the following board members present:

Chairman NeSmith called the meeting to order, and Corey McGee gave the invocation.

Chairman NeSmith recognized Commissioner Grady who made a motion to approve the minutes of the November 22, 2022 Board Meeting. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hickey. The motion was approved unanimously with Chairman NeSmith and Commissioners Baggett, Grady, Gross, Hickey, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.

Open Meeting to the Citizens: Chairman NeSmith recognized Mr. Chandler Giddes of 18938 GA Hwy 3, Thomasville, Georgia and Executive Director of the Thomasville – Thomas County Humane Society. Mr. Giddes expressed hope, although dwindling, that the County and the Humane Society can reach an agreement to remain in partnership. He stated that the Humane Society has far exceeded the contractual agreement, elevated animal services, been a positive impact on the community, and believes its value is well shown and documented. Chairman NeSmith recognized Mr. Colin Dougherty of 104 East Past-time Drive, Thomasville, Georgia a volunteer with the Thomasville-Thomas County Humane Society. Mr. Dougherty expressed the value of continuing the three- decade old relationship with the County. He also stated the importance of animal euthanasia avoidance.

Chairman NeSmith recognized Commissioner Hickey who made a motion to approve the 2023 Budget Resolution for all funds. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Vonier. The motion was approved unanimously with Chairman NeSmith and Commissioners Baggett, Grady, Gross, Hickey, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.

Chairman NeSmith recognized Tax Commissioner Alicia Hester who requested approval to remove insolvent records for mobile homes, real property, and personal property from the tax digest. The records presented represent years 2000 thru 2021. Chairman NeSmith commented that citizens have complained about devaluation of their own property when in close proximation to the property deemed as an eyesore. Planning Director Ken Gay added that the revision of the ordinance in 2023 will include the removal of said mobile homes.

Chairman NeSmith recognized Commissioner Hickey who made a motion to approve the request to remove insolvent records for mobile homes, real property, and personal property from the tax digest as presented by the Tax Commissioner. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Rich. The motion was approved unanimously with Chairman NeSmith and Commissioners Baggett, Grady, Gross, Hickey, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.

Chairman NeSmith recognized County Manager Stephenson who introduced the annual Southern Judicial Circuit Public Defender Contract. Commissioner Grady made a motion to approve the 2023 Public Defender Contract. Commissioner Vonier seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously with Chairman NeSmith and Commissioners Baggett, Grady, Gross, Hickey, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.

### **Board Appointments:**

Chairman NeSmith recognized Commissioner Rich who made a motion to appoint Terry Ross to the Elections and Registration Board. This will be his first term, and the term will expire on 12/2025. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Gross. The motion was approved unanimously with Chairman NeSmith and Commissioners Baggett, Grady, Gross, Hickey, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.

Chairman NeSmith recognized Commissioner Baggett who made a motion to re-appoint Len Powell to the Thomas County Assessor Board. His new term will expire on 12/2025. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Gross. The motion was approved unanimously with Chairman NeSmith and Commissioners Baggett, Grady, Gross, Hickey, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.

#### Reports:

Chairman NeSmith recognized County Manager Stephenson who reminded the Commissioners that capital improvement requests for equipment and vehicles will be made in January 2023.

County Manager Stephenson recognized Planning Director Ken Gay who gave an update on Evergreen Apartments. The developer has requested to be on the January agenda; therefore, Ken is expecting to receive plans within the next few weeks. Other updates include: Phase 1 of the Grand Park Apartments is near completion, preliminary plans for Home2 Suites by Hilton have been received, a pet store is going in on Liberty Street, and plans for a Raceway station on the by-pass and GA Hwy 3 have been received.

Chairman NeSmith recognized Commissioner Vonier who made a motion to ratify the bid award to Willacoochee Industrial Fabrics for Woven Geotextiles. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Rich. The motion was approved unanimously with Chairman NeSmith and Commissioners Baggett, Grady, Gross, Hickey, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.

Commissioner Vonier made a motion to ratify the bid award to Martin Marietta for Aggregate Rock. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Rich. The motion was approved unanimously with Chairman NeSmith and Commissioners Baggett, Grady, Gross, Hickey, Rich, and Vonier voting aye.
