This property is located on Thomas County Map 055D, Parcel 038 and is classified as R-2 (Single Family Residential.) The request is for a conditional use zoning to allow the property to be used as a family personal care home for 2-6 people. If the application is approved, the zoning of the property will be R-2 C.U. (Conditional Use, Family Personal Care Home 2-6 people.) The Planning Staff recommends approval of this rezoning application.
